## Jill's Musings

When we think about church, often what immediately comes to mind is Sunday morning worship. Indeed, worshipping together as a faith community is significant, but being the church is so much more than that. If we imagine Sunday worship as the centre of what we do, there is a whole lot happening on the edges of who we are and of who we are as a church. I can't help but think that it is in these 'edge' spaces that we are seeing the signs of new life emerging. This is very much a gospel thing isn't it? After the Christ who we follow is someone whose life didn't begin at the centre of things, but at the edge, in a stable in Nazareth.

These are some of the 'edge' places where I have seen the Holy Spirit at work lately:

• Our Faith Development Groups: There is a lot going on with each of our groups whether it be the study groups or the meditation group. These provide a space for our church members as well as others in the community to meet and explore their faith. Some of the regular participants who aren't St Andrews members freely admit that Sunday church would never be a place that you would find them but here in these 'edge' spaces they are appreciating the opportunity to engage in matters of faith. Having attended all these groups at some point I am conscious of the rich sharing and exploration that goes on.

**NB:** All our study groups and our meditation groups are always open for you to join in.



- The Movie Fundraiser 'Vai': While this was a great fundraiser in that it netted us \$1,350, it was also a wonderful opportunity for us to get together socially as a faith community and include others in the fold! We sold 92 tickets and quite a number of these were to people outside of our church community. Having events like this helps to enlarge the circle of who we are to include others. It also helps in breaking down barriers for those people who are a bit anti church and who actually find that we are pretty normal and maybe just maybe this is a place that they could connect more with in the future!
- **The Landscaped Community Corner:** As this is being created it is providing more and more opportunity for connection with the local community, beginning with the Hastings District Council and the tradespeople as they have been working here. This will continue as we spend more in this space engaging with others.

- <u>The Maraekakaho Anzac Day Exhibition:</u> We have had two great opportunities to connect with the Maraekakaho community, firstly with the ANZAC day exhibition that Judith Burkin created, putting together posters of the stories of some of the people whose names are on the local cenotaph there. Many people came to the exhibition at the church following the ANZAC service and appreciated the experience. Many admitting that it was a building that they had never set foot in before! With ANZAC day being a significant spiritual day for many New Zealanders, it was great to do this and also provide a prayer space for those who wanted to light a candle of remembrance.
- **The Maraekakaho Concert:** Knowing that such few numbers were engaging with worship services at Maraekakaho for some time (except the Christmas Carol service) we are focusing on making the Maraekakaho church a place of hospitality and engagement together. We had a great first concert with Amy and Steve Dunn which showcased what a great space it is this type of event with great acoustics as well as being a lovely intimate space. Maraekakaho folk, do get in touch if you have further ideas of how we can use this space to help create community.
- The Mothers Lament Service: This was a service for people who struggled with Mother's Day, perhaps they had lost a child or conversely hadn't been able to have children. For whatever reason, Mother's Day was a tough day to navigate. This was advertised widely through social media and we were amazed by the numbers who came, including two mothers who had lost babies in the last few months. This was an important space for people, and again it is something that is on the edge, but it is about meeting people where they are at. Who knows where God might lead them and us in that journey? Already we have been challenged about having a similar service for men something we will plant to do on Father's Day. The interesting thing about this was that the desire for this came from the community, from a woman Karen whose passion was to make this happen, and not from within the church. This again illustrating how new life often emerges from the edges, rather than the centre.

I have a quote I came across somewhere that is pinned to the wall in my office it says this: 'Like Christ, his church does not exist for itself. A congregation that understands this will no longer focus on its own institutional life but reach out of its walls to embody Christ in its community and the world.'

May Christ lead us.

## Notes from the Parish Council Clerk

I write this after another day of blustery westerlies with an untidy pile of leaves at our back door. Perhaps a metaphor for all the winds of change buffeting society and our church! Parish Council has had a very full agenda over recent months so, I'd like to fill you in on some of the activities.

<u>Landscaping Project:</u> As you well be aware this is now underway with excellent progress. Very appropriately Jill led a blessing ceremony on the morning the work began. Its worthwhile noting the great support that we have received from the Hastings District Council both financially and helping to make it happen. On Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May we had a planting day and we anticipate completion in June.

**Power to the People:** Under Chris Lambournes's direction steady progress is being made. PttP while linked to St Andrews will have its own charitable trust oversight role provided and board with an bv Presbytery Central. With Bell Gully's guidance the trust will be formed in the near future. To date there is support for about \$2M of the targeted \$2.7M of funding while 3 pieces of land have been offered as a possible location for the solar farm. A request for "Expressions of Interest" from entities capable of developing the solar farm has also been released. The funding and building of this project of course is only a start as we envisage an ongoing relationship with the community in Flaxmere who will benefit from the program.

Faith Development: A reminder that we have 4 regular activities as well as a new one starting. We currently have weekly study on Thursday mornings lead by Ken Hutchison, meditation on Thursday evenings lead by Noel Bryant, Monthly study again lead by Ken Hutchison, and God & Pizza run by Jill. Currently Parish Council is involved in a "Listening to the neighborhood" program while Jill is initiating a further "Listening to the Neighborhood" program with "Tu Mai Awa"-a group working to tackle domestic violence. A theme of much of our faith development is that it is creating a space for people on the fringe of the church.

**Recent Events:** We have been making a very conscious effort to engage with the community about us. Just three examples include: a display set up by a Maraekakaho local, Judith Burkin, of photos and notes on WW1 veterans in the Maraekakaho Church for ANZAC Day. Many folks came to look and expressed their appreciation.

• a music concert again in the Maraekakaho Church by very talented local musicians Steve & Amy Dunn together with Amy's mum Jenny and her partner Bob. Both the music and acoustics provided by the church were great.

• A movie night organised by Jill that was not only enjoyed by all but raised \$1350.00.

**Coming Events:** On our first Sunday in June at our combined service the Rev Susan Blaikie, the Presbytery Central Mission Catalyst will be preaching. Susan has agreed to work with us in developing a mission plan for St Andrews. As well we will be welcoming Derek Teariki and Colleen Clements as Elders.

- On Saturday June 29<sup>th</sup> there will be a HB Presbytery Workshop from 9.30-1pm in the St Andrews lounge
- Looking even further ahead St Andrews will be the location for the Presbytery Central Gathering on September 21<sup>st</sup>. These are wonderful well-organized events with a number of relevant workshops.

Formation of an Options Group: Most of you will be aware that for many years St Andrews has operated with a significant financial deficit (a predicted this year of approximately \$75,000) and that the balance has been made up by dipping into our reserves. We only have a handful of years before these will be exhausted. With this in mind Parish Council has initiated an options group to explore in detail the range of possibilities of how St Andrews can generate more income. Once the options have been compiled they will be presented back to the congregation for discussion. At this stage the options group comprises Barry Rosenberg, June Clark, Junior MacArthur, Chris Lambourne, and Jim Spall. We are very keen to hear of ideas from everyone, no matter how left field they may be!

**Golden Offering:** Still on matters financial a Golden Offering will be held in June. While many are on limited incomes if everyone gives what they can then we can make a real difference to our deficit. Jesus told many parables and observations on money and the apostles also had a lot to say about it. We are encouraged to be generous and ready to give and to put our trust in God, not riches.





Whether you are

someone who has called St Andrews home your entire life or whether you have recently joined us, whether you are 9 or 90 we look forward to your engagement in this process. Susan is a delightfully engaging woman of God who will make this a fun and enlightening journey to be a part of!

## GOLDEN OFFERING

These are challenging times for many churches. In the past month we have heard of two Presbyterian Churches that have run out of money and have had to let their minister go. While St Andrews still has money in reserve, around half of this can only be used in financing buildings and property. This year our church budget will have a \$76,000 deficit, if we carry on with our current rate of giving, we have less than five years left. This is alarming! However, with God's grace, we have both the time and the resources to turn this around. To do this though we are going to have to work together.

One of the things we are going to do is to have a Golden Offering again this year. This is a special one-off offering of money to assist the church finances. We encourage you to please give generously.



The six questions that arise help to focus churches on what helps or hinders church member identity.

Jennie McCullough: 'EFFECTIVE AND ON THE EDGE'. Hi, my name is Jennie McCullough I am one of the Children and Family Ministry Enablers for Presbytery Central. Thanks, heaps, for inviting me to lead a workshop at the Hawkes Bay Gathering. Planning for this to be an interactive time together

Paul and Michelle Loveday: Establishing a Healing Ministry in a parish. Many people carry deep emotional wounds and barriers to spiritual growth. All too often wounds from the past are covered over by unhealthy habits and unhelpful thought patterns, often resulting in relationship strain or breakdown. Pastoral care is part of the church's response, which can include healing prayer. VMTC BreakFree NZ partners with churches to train people in the healing ministry. Paul and Michelle have been involved with VMTC since 1987. Until two years ago Michelle was in private practice as a counsellor. Paul is currently the President of VMTC NZ. The workshop will be interactive and will also introduce the resources available through VMTC BreakFree.


