


Pastoral Care

Parish Council

At Parish Council we have enjoyed meeting together and reflecting on the life of the church. Our February meeting the focus was on our **Mission Plan** and how in these turbulent times as Elders we can both lead change and provide stability. We determined that communication, pastoral care, relationship building and prayer, to uplift the church were vital.

On the 7th of February you will recall our very well attended congregational meeting where we resolved to enter a long-term lease of the hall to Presbyterian Support East Coast. This is a significant development for St Andrews, with not only a substantial projected lift in our revenue, but also a change in roles for our staff. This formed the basis of our strategic focus at the March Parish Council meeting where we received Finance and Property's Report on how we manage our assets and put them to the best service of our **Mission Plan**.

Pastoral Care

Our April meeting focused on pastoral care. This has many dimensions including worship, prayer, hospitality, caring for others, counselling, and faith formation. As members of a faith community in one way or another we are all responsible for looking out for the other.

Presbytery Central Gathering

Six members of council attended and enjoyed the **Presbytery Central Gathering** on March 20th at St Albans in Palmerston North. We broke into regional groups to discuss our opportunities for mission and consequently, St Andrews and St John's representatives will be meeting to discuss ways of working together. In October **General Assembly** will take place in Christchurch and **Parish Council** has nominated both the **Rev Dianne Gilliam-Weeks** and **Rev Paul Loveday** for **Moderator Elect**.

The Common Good

The Common Good initiative continues to be well attended and received with our last speaker **Rev Charles Waldegrave** giving us an in-depth view of the housing crisis. Introducing Vicki Vaughan

For this issue of the newsletter, I now have the privilege of introducing you to Vicki Vaughan and this is her story.

Hi, my name is Vicki Vaughan, and I was born in Hastings. I am an only child and began my education first at: Mahora, Frimley School, then Hastings Intermediate, and finally at Hastings Girls' High.

My tertiary qualifications are: BA (English and French), B Music (voice), Diploma of Teaching, Master's in counselling, and Diploma in Special Education.

After graduating from college, I spent the first 20 years, Teaching in Primary, Intermediate and Secondary schools in Wellington and Auckland. Then 3 years later I was Tutoring Advanced Studies for Practicing Teachers, specialising in Special Needs education in Primary and Secondary Schools, and setting up a Special Needs Unit at Long Bay College.

The next 20 years I have been working as a Special Education Adviser in Ministry of Education in Northland and Hawke's Bay, working with teachers and parents of children with severe and challenging behaviours, and children with disabilities. I am still working 3 days per week for Ministry of Education.

I was married to Stewart Lockhart (a lawyer, also from Hastings,) for 14 years. We lived 10 years in Wellington and then moved to Auckland in 1986. We have 2 daughters, who both live in Auckland, and have 5 grandchildren.

After my divorce from Stewart, I met and married Lew Ritchie, a Marine Biologist and we moved to Matapouri (1 hour out of Whangarei). I continued Working for Ministry of Education while also setting up a boat-charter eco-tour business in Northland, on our historic kauri-hulled boat. Sleeping about 12 – 17 people on stay-aways.

Lew died in 2008, and I moved to Hastings in 2009 to care for my ailing father.

I attended worship service on a Sunday morning at St Andrews Church and now I am currently involved with St Andrews through the Meditation Group, Bible Study Group, Coffee-and-chat group, occasional door duties and helping to coordinate rides to church.

I was asked what is the one bible verse that I especially love, but most weeks, this has been the passage that I have read and studied most recently with the Bible Study Group.

My hopes and dreams for St Andrews faith community? - As a newcomer, I'm still learning about this, but I very much enjoy the friendliness and openness of the people, and I admire

the commitment to reducing the pain and isolation of the homeless and needy in the community.

For my hobbies and relaxation: I like to sing with Napier Civic Choir, and Festival Opera Chorus, also I'm involved in supporting young trainee opera singers, in PPV. (That is the Project Prima Volta program).

I like to spend lots of time in the garden. I grow ornamentals and fruit trees, but I let other



people grow most of my vegies. I enjoy going for daily walks or bike-rides along local rivers and beaches with my big golden mutt, Lola, reading (mainly women authors, novels, poetry) and occasional handwork (lots of incomplete projects).

My taste in music ranges from: Mainly listening to classical (orchestral, choral, opera, chamber, piano....) music, to enjoy listening to contemporary, experimental, and indigenous music.

And, as most of St Andrew's congregation knows already, I enjoy a good yell on a Sunday

There have been so many people I admire and have influenced me in my life. I seem to have been blessed with a huge procession of kind, loving, and talented people throughout my life. I reckon I can learn something valuable from pretty much anyone I know!!!

During Lockdown I was very lucky to be paired with Fay Mair and I read Jill's worship service to Fay over the phone each Sunday. Fay had an enormous knowledge of scripture and worship and we became close friends, even though we had never actually seen each other. She taught me a huge amount in the short time I knew her.

One more thing that I would like to share with you and that is a retirement project: That is,

that my one ambition, I have had for a long time, is to have a small group that visits local Rest Homes and holds Singalongs with the residents. Maybe not so far away!


