

It was also wonderful to experience such bicultural worship where we alternated between song and waiata.

Please keep both Teorepi and Wendy in your prayers as they begin their respective roles within our faith community.





#### **Notes from the Parish Council Clerk**

Greetings everyone. Isn't it nice to be at the end of winter with the official start of spring only days away. We are surrounded by signs of new life with the daffodils out, blossoming trees and on our farm new lambs and calves. At St Andrews we also have some new developments full of promise.





At our August Parish Council meeting we heard a presentation by Chris Lamborne on a project he is working on with the aim to provide free or low cost electricity to 400 low income households in Flaxmere by building a solar panel farm. All of us who pay the electricity bills are aware of the rising cost of power; in fact Salvation Army research reveals that 40% of NZ households struggle to pay for power. Parish Council agreed to support the concept of being a nest for this project. This means no financial obligation for St Andrews but provides a home for the project to get underway while a business case is developed.

Parish Council has also approved a host of new health and safety policies ranging from safety and protection of leaders, children and youth through to dealing with stress at work. Some of these may seem pedantic but are really necessary to provide a safe and secure framework for everyone at St Andrews. Thank you to everyone who assisted at the recent working bee. We had a fantastic clean out and clean up with trailer and ute loads off to the recycling centre!

#### Power to the People

We all know how expensive electricity can be and recent statistics are showing more and more low income families are needing extra help with energy costs. Power to the People is a mission project that aims to provide low income households with free and cheaper power for up to 400 households in Flaxmere. This will be achieved by PttP operating a PV solar farm and also purchasing electricity from the wholesale market. PttP would act as the electricity retailer to those low income households.

St Andrew's is supporting the PttP mission proposal. At August's Parish Council it was decided to step up as a "nest" in which PttP could grow. This will include providing key people to be on the governance group. Right now we are starting to develop the Feasibility Study. This type of study looks at proposal in some detail, and then gives it a good shake to test if it is viable.

Part of this process sees people who have an interest in the concept being contacted and asked for input..

We have met with the Hastings District Council as well as Unison to discuss PttP and are very encouraged by the response we are receiving.

St Paul's Napier is very interested in this project and have asked us to give a presentation at its next parish council meeting so they can explore how they can contribute.

#### Lighthouse 2018

From 3-5 August 2018 Junior and I had the privilege of accompanying our Minister Jill and Chris Lambourne to Lighthouse 2018, held at Vaughan Park retreat, Long Bay, Auckland. The weekend was facilitated by Rev, Dr Steve Taylor, Principal of KCML, Dr Christine Woods (Assoc. Prof Auckland Uni Business School) and Charissa Nicol (KCML intern). In short, the lighthouse weekend was a 3 day workshop sponsored by the Presbyterian Development Society to identify and develop entrepreneurial and innovative initiatives. Six teams representing Presbyterian parishes from all over NZ presented their concepts to the wider group. With the help of Dr Christine Woods who facilitated the workshops, the wider group contributed to the refining process which improved all of our initiatives that we brought to the weekend.

For me, the weekend helped me grow and develop my own business idea. I'm amazed at God's timing and how relevant and powerful this weekend was for my own ideas of entrepreneurship. For Junior it was great to see the Presbyterian Church recognising that innovation is not exclusive to the church. The Lighthouse weekend is a great space to foster and promote entrepreneurs and their ideas.

### INTRODUCING BARRY NASH

I was born in Auckland in the late forties with one older brother (David). My younger sister (Ngaire) joined us five years later.

I attended Primary and High Schools in Papatoetoe and apart from a 2 year period living in Kaitaia the family stayed in Papatoetoe. I met my first wife at a High School dance, we eventually married and had two great children. Catherine, who now lives in Havelock North and Michael who is in Palmerston North.

My plan as a teenager was to join the NZ Police as a cadet at age 17. This plan came unstuck when an assessor decided my eyesight wasn't up to standard. Plan B saw me join the Royal New Zealand Navy as a Medical Assistant. The first few years were general medic duties then training as an X-Ray Technician. My first overseas posting was to Vietnam in 1970, as part of the New Zealand Services Medical Team which had been providing medical services in a 100 bed civilian hospital. I spent the next 12 months working in the operating theatre doing anaesthetics. This proved to be the most rewarding part of the 22 years spent in the Navy. My first sea posting included six months in Hawaii and San Diego. I was commissioned as a Lieutenant and the remainder of my time was spent in Wellington, Singapore and at Devonport in a range of roles including training of Medical Branch staff, Hospital Administration and Personnel positions.

I retired from the Navy (aged 38) with a lot of experience, but without any civilian qualifications, so I started my training as an Anaesthetic Technician at Auckland Public Hospital. A very busy and satisfying time was spent working there. The best part of the job was being sent to a conference in Dunedin which is where I met my wife Bev. who was President of the Anaesthetic Technicians Society (I had been elected Vice President.) I moved to Hastings in 1993 and started attending St Andrews with Bev. She was my "boss" for a few months at Hastings Hospital before I started at Princess Alexandra Hospital in Napier. After 12 months in Napier I started working for ACC as a Case Manager and remained there for 17 years (during which time I completed a post graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Studies.)

Bev finally agreed to marry me in 1999, the ceremony took place during a Sunday Service at St Andrews. It was a great occasion with the congregation joining us in the hall for a cuppa and cutting the cake. We have enjoyed some wonderful holidays both in NZ and overseas.

I am currently on the Church Board of managers.

For relaxation, I enjoy listening to most types of music and spend spare time reading, doing word puzzles and sudoku. Our dog of course needs her daily walk and is great company.


